**Job Title:** HHPG Facilitator/Case Worker

## **JOB SUMMARY;**

The goal of this position is to assist families with meeting their basic needs. This is done by providing direct service (casework) to eligible consumers to stabilize essential needs including permanent safe and affordable housing, utilities, transportation, home repairs, and information and or referrals for additional services both internal and external from CAP. This will be done with funding from grants, including Tenant Based Rental Assistance (NYS), Healthy Homes Production (HUD) and others.

Facilitator will guide activities to ensure consumers have the needed services to achieve healthy independence within the community and progress towards self-sufficiency. Program outcomes will be accounted for by keeping accurate records and client data by implementing the policies and procedures of the agency and grantors.

## **JOB DUTIES:**

- Meet with individuals and families in an office location or alternate location convenient to the consumer.
- Conduct intakes and review applications to determine eligibility for the programs and facilitate the consumer's identification of needs.
- Distribute financial and in-kind resources to address client needs based on agency protocols and eligibility criteria.
- Meet performance targets as set by grantors and the agency in the delivery of services to eligible consumers
- Create outreach materials, applications, or other documents as needed
- Keep accurate records, comprehensive case notes, and demographic information as required by grantors and the agency.
- Perform home and apartment inspections to determine safe and adequate housing
- Provide resources and referrals if needed for other services.
- Other duties as assigned.

## **QUALIFICATION STANDARDS:**

- Associates Degree in Human Services or related degree and at least two years' experience working in human services preferred; or
- A Bachelor's Degree in Human Services or related field with one year of human service experience; or
- In lieu of a college degree, at least five years of experience working in human services or related field.

- Must possess strong oral and written communication skills, the ability to work independently and as a team member, ability to keep information confidential, and the ability to establish healthy client/worker boundaries.
- Proficient in use of computer and Microsoft applications (particularly Word and excel); experience with automated data bases preferred.
- Knowledge of Madison County resources preferred
- Valid driver's license and own transportation.
